

The sight of 38 cars lined up outside the Wooden Bridge Hotel, Guildford, on a fine Sunday afternoon shewed that the first motoring event of the Club was under way.

Starting at 1 minute intervals a very varied selection of motor transport left on what was to prove an easy route through Send, Ripley, Clandon and Ranmore to Dorking. If the route was easy the facts and figures to be noted on the way were not; from the number of Petrol pumps reported ar a certain garage it would have seemed that some members were themselves running on pure alcohol! Before crossing Ranmore Common into Dorking, Competitors underwent a series of tests their patience being one of them! But after the delay some interesting exhibitions of slow driving were seen, among them the recording of fastest time of the day by the Secretary! After a break for tea at Dorking the average speed run led to the finish at the Black Horse Hotel at Gomshall. Accusations that the Marshals had timed this last section with an egg—timer were hotly denied - by the Marshals!

calculated under pressure.

The Crew, consisting of Arthur Knight, David Cobbett, Bob Jennings and Derek Saunders, started from Hindhead at 9.50 p.m. and after an

eventful night completed the Course at approximately 3.40 a.m.

All eight points were found by Six Figure Map References, with the exception of one, which was a Moving Control. This consisted of a car travelling round a certain selection of roads throughout the night at an average speed of 22 m.p.h., and entailed dropping David by the roadside to get the registration number, whilst the rest of the Crew found another fixed point.

Special ests included a Point that the Driver had to find alone, whilst Bob had to push a weighted tyre between oil drums in a wiggle

woggle, both of which were timed.

After all this and many other adventures, too numerous to mention, the Crew finally sat down at the finish to the Englishman's finest meal - Eggs and Bacon!!!
