DRMDT maladies.

Lorraine and I have driven most of the route for this year's event and have the exact mileages for the road book. I say 'most', as we were almost halfway through the return leg of the route and approaching the staggered crossroads at Kingsley, when a warning light came on on the Mazda dash.

It told me the front nearside tyre was low on pressure at 25PSI. Nothing much to worry about, I'll pump it up when we get home, say's I.

By the time we'd travelled a couple of hundred yards further North to the junction, it was down to 15PSI – something a bit more serious was going on. Rather than stop on the busy B3004, we stayed on the route, went across the crossroads and stopped in the old sand pit entrance. PSI was now down to single figures. A quick look confirmed it was definitely flat. Luckily, only at the bottom, so I opened the boot to get the spare.

Oh, silly me. This being a modern car and build to a very strict budget there is no spare, just a small compressor and a tub of gloop. Following the instructions, I removed the valve core and poured the gloop in. Replaced the valve core and connected the compressor up. I was expecting a small amount of the white gloop to trickle from the hole, but it gushed out. At least I knew now where the puncture was. A large sharp stone had punched a hole the size of the Mersey Tunnel into the shoulder of the tyre. By now, the entire tub of gloop was running down the road and the tyre was flatter than a flat thing.

Fortunately, I'm also a member of CSMA which comes with Britannia rescue, so I made the call, and we suffered the ignominy of being taken home of the back of a truck.

What a damn nuisance. If we'd had a spare, we could have finished the route and still got home at the same time. Whilst sitting in the drizzle at the side of the road to South Hay and Binstead, I vowed never to buy another car that doesn't have a spare tyre. A bottle of gloop and a compressor are of no use at all if you suffer anything other than a tiny hole in the middle of the tread.

Heed the words of a bitter and twisted man, who must now go back out and finish the mileage checks, when he should be in his garage putting his Alpine back together.

And talking of the Alpine – after deciding during the initial lockdown (2+ years ago), that I would 'just' fix the paintwork at the front of the Alpine – it looked like it had developed a nasty rash and gone 'bobbly', I have finally got my a*se into gear and put some colour back on it.





After a disastrous first attempt at applying the colour, when I had the spray gun set up completely wrong and had to sand off the paint I'd applied. I have now got my act together and sorted the gun. The photos of the nearside wing and door show a nice shiny finish. I'll now move the car over to the other side of my narrow garage, apply a bit of high-build primer and several coats of red gloss.

With a bit of good fortune, a following wind and no more punctures, I might, just, have it ready to use on the DRMDT.

London to Brighton Veteran Car Run 6th November

Barry Guess is running the London to Brighton Veteran Car Run this year and would like a bit of help.

Below is his email and if you'd like to help out, let me know as soon as you can and I'll pass the names on to Barry.

Taking place on Sunday 6th November, running between London's Hyde Park Corner and Madeira Drive Brighton, the VCR is the oldest motoring event in the world and is celebrates its 126th year with over 370 pre-1905 veteran cars (plus a few motorcycles and even Penny-Farthing) all battling their way down the A23 towards the seaside.



The spectacle can be watched by somewhere between 50,000 - 100,000

people, all lining the 60-mile route, waving and cheering these worthy veterans who are celebrating the scrapping of the 4mph speed limit, and the need for that man with a Red Flag.

Keeping this iconic event flowing and safe is where you may be able to help me as it takes an army of volunteers to simply keep an eye on everybody, some sitting in their cars at road junctions, or for the energetic, helping at the more complex or 'difficult' sections throughout the various towns and villages. I am also still seeking observant car counters for half a dozen 'checkpoints' along the route so if you are good in that area then please let me know.

Mostly however, its giving the veterans a hearty wave as they pass by with just a wary eye on anybody standing somewhere stupid (yes they do!). The traffic flow is generally managed by certified Traffic Marshals and so you will not be asked to confront or stop angry motorists as that's not your job.

The time frame ranges throughout the early part of the day, dependent on location with the London / Surrey area running predominantly from 6:30am - 10 whilst Surrey and Sussex spring into life a little later.



Spotted ...

The recent well supported Brighton and Hove MC Sprint at Goodwood in August contained the usual entry for most sprints a wide selection of road cars along with a few modified ones. Because of their nature you will find ex competition cars and single seaters running as well. All of course having to comply with Goodwood's noise restrictions.

The entry for the Brighton event was no exception, however, lurking in the paddock bays was a very orange single seater. The colour was a bit of a give-away - a McLaren M18 F5000 car. Speaking with the owner/driver Martin Cowell and a spot of research I was able to find out more about the cars history.

87 MLARENCARE

This car was built for 1971 F5000 season by Team Trojan for McLaren, Team Trojan built McLaren's customer

cars at that time. For 1971 the Swede Ulf Norinder raced the car, its first race was at Silverstone in May 1971. In 1972 the car was taken over by Speed International Racing who entered the car for Ray Allen who contested most of that year's F5000 championship. With the rounds that Ray Allen didn't contest the car was taken over by David Prophet and Gijs van Lennep.

The car was not seen during the following year and emerged in 1974 as a show car for Shell who sponsored the F5000 Championship. The trail then goes cold, until 1984 when

it re-appeared in the hands of Gerry Walton who raced it for several years in HSCC event before crashing it at Oulton Park. It was subsequently repaired but only to become damaged again when a lorry reversed into it!

The current owner Martin Cowell purchased the car in 1996 and had it repainted in the iconic McLaren colours.

As you will see from the list the films cover a wide range of motoring related topics. Racing and Rallying are well covered along with drivers and personalities and of course some period oddities!


Individual DVDs are available to hire from the Club to members only.

We think we have sorted your winters evening viewing!




