

Elsewhere in this issue you will find a series of pictures from the Concours of Elegance at Hampton Court. Most of the cars on display are pristine and shiny, naturally there are a few exceptions and this Ferrari, speaking with the owner, had an interesting story behind it.

This is a 1955 Ferrari 250 GT Europa, records suggest that

there are between 35 and 43 examples built and this particular car is numbered 29. It was built for a Dr. Enrico Wax who was the Italian distributor of Moet & Chandon, Johnnie Walker Whisky and Connolly Leather. Dr Wax would buy a new Ferrari, often very personalised, every year. Records show he did this from 1950 to 1974. Very little is known about the car's early history in Italy. It was eventually sold to William Gottwald in Southern California in 1960. Gottwald was a mechanical engineer and in 1967 the car experienced a failure which he was unable to cure. The car would end

up sitting in a remote corner of a workshop for 60 years. The car was only discovered after Gottwalds death and was subsequently auctioned by Gooding & Company for \$2,222,000.

Before being displayed at Hampton Court it was shown at the Pebble Beach Concours in California in August. The owner has had some work done on the car mainly to get it running again and roadworthy. He is resisting the temptation of doing a full restoration as the car is much more significant in its 'as found' condition.

The 250 GT Europa was quite a ground breaking car for Ferrari, it was the first proper GT and made use of what is known as the Colombo V12, but was also the start of the famed 250 line that spawned many of the world's most desirable cars.

The 1908 DARRACQ SS "Happy Car" in action at Hampton Court 2022.

DARRACQ was a major name in the early days of motoring.

The company was the brainchild of Alexandre Darracq, who had sold his Gladiator cycle factory and, with the profits, set up shop in 1897 in Suresne near Paris under the name Darracq et Cie. The first vehicles were powered by a light engine under license from Léon Bollée, soon developing his own engine that allowed the company to find its market: by 1910 Darracq & Cie accounted for 10% of the production of motor cars in France and ranked number three manufacturer behind Renault and Peugeot.

As early as 1906, Alexandre Darracq secured a number of partnerships with other European entrepreneurs in order to expand the business: joint venture companies were created with Opel in Germany, Weir in the UK and Vitoria in Spain all selling cars under the Darracq brand. The same year a subsidiary of Darracq & Cie was set up in Italy as ALFA and later sold to Nicola Romeo to create ALFA Romeo in 1918.

From 1905, Alexandre Darracq saw in Land Speed Record and competition the opportunity to test new technologies and promote its cars: several Darracq cars achieved good results including outright wins in the Gordon Bennett race in 1905 as well as the Vanderbilt Cup in 1905 and 1906 or the Targa Florio in 1907. Aside from a number of hill climb or other circuit race participations in Europe, USA or as far as Cuba, Darracq cars secured a number of Land Speed Record the most memorable being the 198 km/h achieved in 1905 on Daytona Beach with the Darracq 25 liters V8 with 200 HP later sold by the factory to a

scion of the Guinness family.

In 1913, Darracq & Cie merged with its UK STD Ltd (Sunbeam Talbot

subsidiary in order to receive financing from a group of British investors alongside Talbot and Sunbeam leading to the creation in 1920 of

Darracq) at which stage Alexandre Darracq retired in Monaco. STD was itself acquired by Roots in 1935 and its French subsidiary sold to Anthony Lago to create Talbot Lago.

As you will see from the list the films cover a wide range of motoring related topics. Racing and Rallying are well covered along with drivers and personalities and of course some period oddities!


Individual DVDs are available to hire from the Club to members only.

We think we have sorted your winters evening viewing!




