

This year we have requested that we get to run a post or two out on the track, rather than the Start/Finish.



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Tunbridge Wells and Sevenoaks Sprint - Goodwood
















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Routine Maintenance in the Feeney Fleet

I'd never been overly impressed with the handbrake on my Freelander 2. Some time ago, I adjusted the shoes by turning the cogged wheel through the tiny inspection hole in the disc, but it made little difference. Recently, the rear discs were beginning to get a bit scored and noisy, so I made a trip down to my local motor factors and got a set of pads, discs, and handbrake shoes – in exchange for an arm and a leg.

More modern cars have the handbrake working on the pads, thus making it easier (and cheaper) to replace. The Landy harks back to the dark ages when drum brakes were at the cutting edge of vehicular retardation. So, you have pads and discs for the footbrake, but a drum section built into the rear disc for the handbrake to work on.

It's a bit of a fiddly job to balance the handbrake cable in the holder on the shoe with the return springs whilst getting it past the hub. But it can be done – with several practice attempts! At least the pistons slide back into the caliper without needing the wind-back tool.

Next up is a visit to the tyre shop of a new set of All Terrain tyres and tracking correction as the front N/S has worn alarmingly quickly. And, if it ever stops raining for long enough, I have to separate the N/S bottom ball joint as the boot has split.

Number 1 grandson, Joseph, passed his test a few weeks ago (obviously, in no small part due to the expert tuition given by yours truly). He is clocking up the miles in his little 1.0 Corsa. Unfortunately, some ne'er-do-well bumped into the back of him at some lights the other day. Joseph, not knowing what to do in the circumstance drove forward and parked at the side of the road. The ne'er-do-well promptly turned round and drove off the other way. Lesson learned! No real damage done to the Corsa, but it had cracked the plastic bumper. So, we had a nice hour or two with him learning how to sand, prep and paint the bumper. It's not perfect, but at least there are no runs in it.

He already knows so much more about car repair and maintenance than his dad ever will.
